**Important Reminders:**

- 1.A maximum of 9 credits will be approved as graduation credits for cross-departmental courses.
- 2.Minimum graduation credits: 36 credits, including 16 required credits (comprising 6 credits for the thesis writing) and 20 elective credits.
- 3.Master's students are required to publish at least one seminar paper before graduation.
- 4.The Department has established one of graduation requirements for English proficiency, and only those who meet all requirements can graduate.
- 5.Classes are scheduled on weekday evenings from Monday to Friday or on weekends (Saturday and Sunday).
