Important Reminders:

1. A maximum of 9 credits will be approved as graduation credits for cross-departmental courses.
2. Minimum graduation credits: 36 credits, including 16 required credits and 20 elective credits.
3. Master's students are required to publish at least one seminar paper before graduation.
4. For those admitted to our department who are not from the same field or a related field, it is required to take supplementary undergraduate courses, specifically in "Introduction to Tourism and Leisure". Another foundational subject will be designated by the advisor. The credits for these courses will not be counted toward the master's degree credits.
5. The Department has established one of graduation requirements for English proficiency, and only those who meet all requirements can graduate.
